Quality vocational education is crucial for sustainable growth and employment in developing countries. It helps create jobs and fight poverty, but also reduces inequality and strengthen social cohesion within and between communities.


The craft and construction sector are examples of branches where there are plenty of opportunities for large groups of people. Often also the materials are present to create a flourishing manufacturing industry.

However, to start as a craftsman or woman, young people must have the right practical and theoretical skills and experience. Unfortunately, the quality of vocational education in developing countries is often poor and unattainable for many. In addition, good tools and machines are expensive. This, along with lack of entrepreneurial knowledge and 'soft' skills, is a real obstacle.

VOCATIONAL TRAINING: SKILLS FOR LIFE

Gered Gereedschap is a NGO based in The Netherlands which has been making a consistent effort for craftsmen and women in developing countries for the last 37 years. Projects supported by Gered Gereedschap strengthen technical vocational education and promote entrepreneurship in Africa. In doing so, we aim to increase employment among craftsmen and women. For example by strengthening vocational training institutes as part of our EQUIP educational programme.

Quality education is the keystone of craftsmanship. This forms the basis. It is the way to learn both theory and practice. That is why we pursue good quality vocational education, available to everyone. We also ensure a good start and support young craftsmen after their training with their first steps into the labour market. We do this by supporting vocational training institutes with:



THE EQUIP - JINJA PROJECT: VOCATIONAL TRAINING



Aiming to maximise its impact, Gered **EOUIP** Gereedschap focuses on a limited number BY GERED GEREEDSCHAP of regions in Africa. We always cooperate with local partners to strengthen technical vocational education with various 'building blocks' from our programmes.

In the Jinja region, Uganda we launch a comprehensive five-year project for training and employment creation. As part of this programme, Gered Gereedschap support its partners to strengthen at least 14 schools for vocational training.

PARTNERING WITH LOCAL ACTORS

In implementing the Jinja Project, Gered Gereedschap cooperates with 14 schools that are members of the Uganda Association of Private Vocational Institutions. Local businesses, goverment and trade- and employers' associations are also involved. The programme is managed with the local organisation PEFO and the Dutch NGO Edukans, which specialises in curriculum development and teacher training.
